EmComm Go-Kit Power Considerations

The goal of a go-kit is to have a relatively small, light, and portable package with the most capability. A Ham can be prepared for public service events and emergency situations much quicker if a go-kit is assembled prior to being needed.

Power is one category of items needed in a Go-Kit. Power for our radios can be supplied from any number of sources. 120 VAC from the grid is naturally preferred but other sources such as a generator may be available. 12 VDC from a battery or supplied by a vehicle could supply a radio directly and be the bridge between the initial outage and firing up the generator.

When 120 VAC is available from any source an extension cord and power strip may be needed to get power to your operating position. If power is supplied by a small generator, a surge / spike suppressor is a good idea. A switching type

power supply to produce 12VDC is good for a go-kit because they are light, small, and powerful. I use an MFJ-4230MV which is rated for 30A peak, weighs 3lbs, and is small (5Wx2.5Hx6D). Many different models and brands are available. The 4230 has adjustable output, current/voltage meter, and an internal fan that only comes on when needed. Some type of fused distribution panel is needed so all of your devices can use the 12 volt supply. Rig Runners are good with individual fuses for each output but I consider them too big and heavy for a go-kit. One fuse is sufficient for our needs and can be in the power supply line before the distribution panel. Some devices will have small in-line fuses. Spare fuses should always be included in a go-kit. Distribution wiring should be heavy 10 or 12 gauge with all 12 volt cables terminated with Power Poles for compatibility with other operators.

When 120VAC is not available, having a 12 volt battery will be necessary. A larger capacity battery is better but the portability of the go-kit must be considered. When using a battery, operating times can be extended if there is a means of recharging. There are several means to recharge a battery. Solar panels, using a vehicle's 12 volt system, a small portable wind generator, gasoline generators, and even military surplus hand crank generators will work but most are outside the "easily moved and set up" requirement of a go-kit. When using a battery, a battery booster such as an MFJ-4416B can be helpful. A battery booster increases the battery voltage from a nominal 12 volts to 13.8 volts. Many transmitters need 13 plus volts to put out a full power distortion free signal.

Having a collection of adapters is beneficial to adapt power poles to different power sources. Some examples would be battery clips, cigarette lighter plugs and sockets, ring and spade terminals, and even bare wire. Adapters for using the 12 volts from the distribution panel would include 2.1mm coaxial plugs and other custom adapters for your equipment / radios. It would also be important to have adaptors that change 12 volts to 19, 9, 6, and 5 volts for computers, cell phones, scanners, and tablets.

The Starved Rock Radio Club Hamfest in June will be sponsoring a Go-Kit Contest. It will take place at the conclusion of the VE Session, approximately 11AM. We hope this will become an annual event. Club members as well as non members are encouraged to assemble a Go-Kit and participate in the contest.
