EmComm Go-Kit Antenna Considerations by K9ZQ

The purpose of the Go-Kit is for the Ham to be prepared in emergency situations.

Antennas are another category of items needed in a Go-Kit. For those of us that support a particular served agency putting up antennas before they are needed makes a lot of sense. Activations do not always occur in the best of weather conditions and putting up an antenna can be a time consuming endeavor. A pre placed antenna needs to be tested occasionally to make sure time and weather have not made it inoperable. Having an outdoor antenna increases signals on transmit and receive and may make simplex operation possible in the event of a repeater failure.

For some deployments an outdoor 2M / 70CM antenna may be sufficient. Using a push up fiberglass pole with a twin lead j-pole is a light and portable way to get an antenna 40 foot in the air for temporary operation. HF operation might be more complex because a dipole is considerably longer and needs multiple supports. An end fed half wave can be used with a fiberglass push up pole as a vertical with very good results and does not have the large footprint of a dipole. The fiberglass pole may need rope for guys if there are moderate or stronger winds and some clamping arrangement for support at the base of the pole. Using a random length long wire suspended from a tree is another option if a tuner is available.

Some tuners are more accepting of a large mismatch than others. Typically, a tuner built in the radio is least able to tune a mismatch and a manual tuner is the most able to tune a large mismatch. In all cases the combination of radio, tuner and antenna setup should be tested and configured before it is needed.

A NVIS (Near Vertical Incidence Skywave) antenna can be used on HF if the targeted stations are within a few hundred miles. A 40 meter antenna NIVS

antenna would be a 40 meter dipole suspended about 7 feet off the ground. The radio waves are beamed straight up and then are reflected back down in an umbrella looking pattern.

Field Day is a perfect opportunity to check out radio, antenna, and power combinations under field conditions. There are many operators on the air from all across the country wanting to make contacts. Antenna and power outputs can be changed to see how propagation and directivity issues make a difference for a contacting a specific location.

The Starved Rock Radio Club Hamfest in June will be sponsoring a Go-Kit Contest. It will take place at the conclusion of the VE Session, approximately 11AM. Judges for the contest will be winners from last year's Peoria Superfest and local EC's . We hope this will become an annual event. Club members as well as non members are encouraged to assemble a Go-Kit and participate in the contest.
